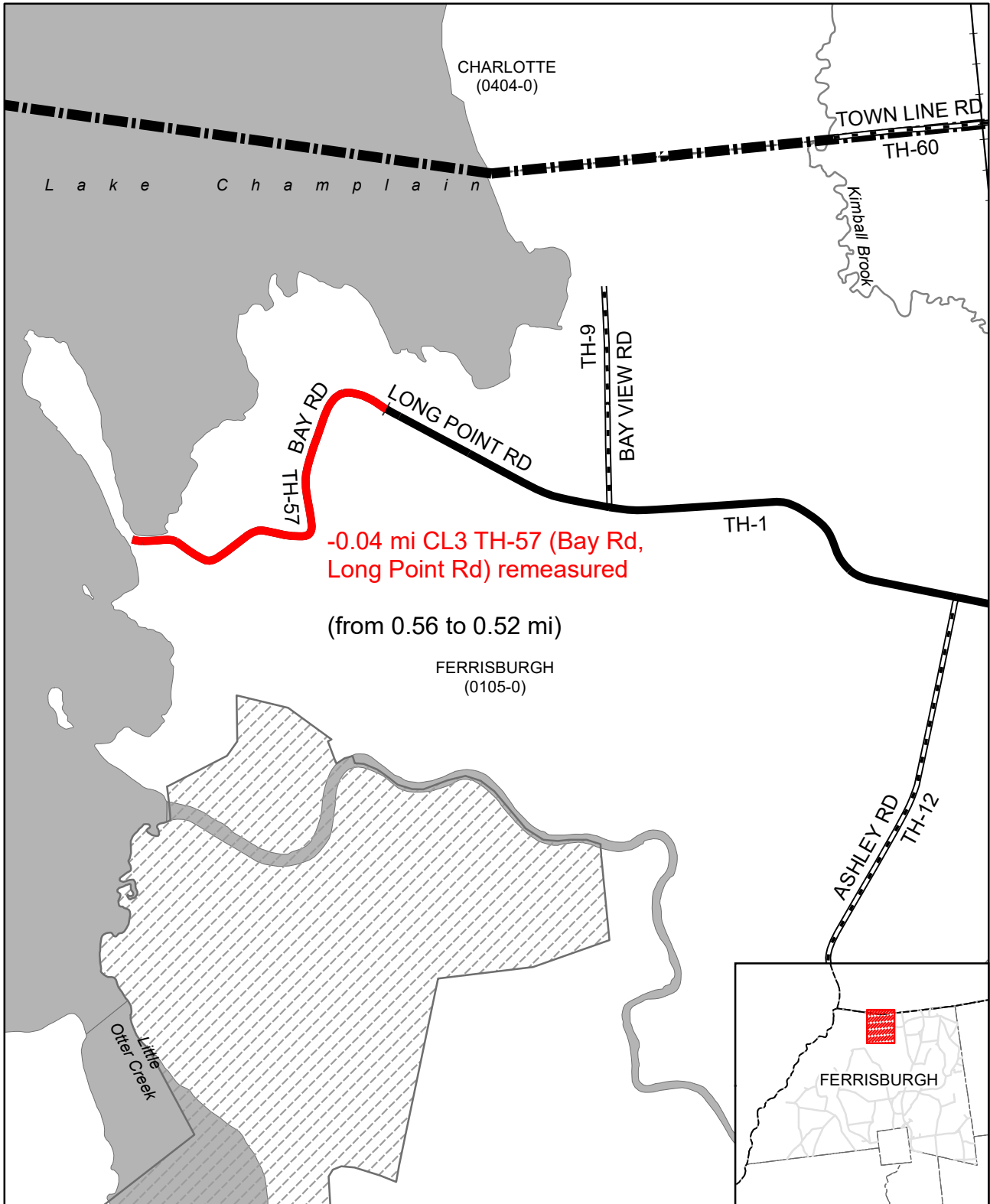

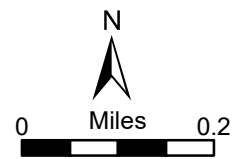

1. 6:30 p.m. Call regular meeting to order

Jessica James called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

Clark Hinsdale moved to amend the agenda and add Item 3.a) Personal Point. Red Muir seconded the motion. All voted in favor. MOTION PASSED

2. Approve Minutes – Regular meeting February 7, 2023, Special Selectboard Meeting February 8, 2023

Jim Benoit moved to approve the regular meeting minutes of February 7, 2023 as presented. Clark Hinsdale seconded the motion. All voted in favor. MOTION PASSED

Red Muir moved to approve the Special Selectboard meeting minutes of February 8, 2023 as presented. Jim Benoit seconded the motion. All voted in favor. MOTION PASSED

4. Selectboard New Business

a) John Bull – Highway Operations Report

John Bull reported they have been working on Jersey Street removing dead trees. Due to the weather some roads have weight limits posted and he has been processing overweight permits. The repeater for the town radios has been installed and the final cost was under budget. He has negotiated the stone price with Pike Industries with a 10% discount. He will begin reviewing fuel options.

John Bull submitted his statement regarding the incident on Shellhouse Mountain Road.

b) Remeasurement to Mileage Certificate

Kerry Alley with the state mapping department has had conversations with John Bull regarding the 2023 Mileage Certificate and has requested a change to the measurement on Bay Road.

Clark Hinsdale moved to approve the remeasurement. Jim Benoit seconded the motion. All voted in favor. MOTION PASSED

- c) Request to allow FCS students to tap maple trees on the town green, request from Judy Elson**
Judy Elson requested permission for the FCS students to tap the maple trees on the town green. They will be inspected by Joe Nelson before tapping. Red Muir asked that Joe also provide feedback on any branches that should be removed.

Clark Hinsdale moved to allow the FCS students to tap the maple trees on the town green. Jim Benoit seconded the motion. All voted in favor. MOTION PASSED

Class 3 Long Pt. Rd

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State of Vermont,

Addison County, ss. Order

We, the selectmen of Ferrisburgh in said County, upon petition and proceedings duly had at said Ferrisburgh on July 31st and August 15, 1936, do determine and adjudge that the public good and the necessity and convenience of individuals require that a highway be laid out at Long Point in said Ferrisburgh across lands of Guy Ball from the westerly end of the present highway at or near the residence of the late Artemas A. Ball to the low water mark of Lake Champlain at the south end of the bay near Long Point and to the low water mark of Lake Champlain on the westerly side of the neck of land connecting Long Point with the main land, and we do accordingly order that said highway be laid out according to the following survey:

Beginning at a point in or near the center of the present highway and in range with the west line of the house occupied by Guy Dingler, said house being the former homestead of Artemas A. Ball and now owned by Guy Ball and 42.0 feet distant southerly from the southwest corner of said house;

Thence North 44-20-West, 6 rods, 14.5 links to a point "A"; said point "A" being 20.0 feet northerly from the northeast corner of the Barn and 25.0 feet southerly from the southwest corner of the Pump or Milk house;

Thence North 70-00-West, 13 rods, 3.3 links to a point "B";

Thence South 80-25-West, 5 rods, 1.5 links to a point "C";

Thence South 38-35-West, 6 rods, 16.4 links to a point "D";

Thence South 26-40 - West, 26 rods, 16.2 links to a point "E";

Thence South 10-35 - West, 7 rods, 2.9 links to a point "F";

Thence South 00-30 - West, 14 rods, 17.0 links to a point "G";

Thence South 13-05 - West, 8 rods, 4.5 links to a point "H";

Thence North 84-05 - West, 7 rods, 10.8 links to a point "I";

Thence North 59-15 - West, 8 rods, 1.0 links to a point "J";

Thence North 58-50 - West, 9 rods, 16.7 links to a point "K";

Thence South 73-15 - West, 23 rods, 16.8 links to a point "L";

Thence North 35-15 - West 20 rods, 10.6 links to a point "M";

Thence North 68-05 - West, 20 rods, more or less to the Low Water Mark in Lake Champlain.

The above described line is the Center Line of said Proposed Highway. Said highway is to be Three rods wide, One & one-half rods on each side of said Center Line, and parallel thereto.

And it was further ordered that two months time from the date of this order shall be given to the said James A. Corey, Guardian of said Guy Ball, within which to remove any fence or buildings from the land taken by reason of the foregoing order.

Good morning Pam,

I just realized that Ferrisburgh has already returned the 2023 Mileage Certificate, but I've been working with John Bull to pin down where both class 2 TH-1 and class 3 TH-57 begin and end, in order to ensure that we have the correct mileage for these highways. Could you ask the Selectboard if I can add a remeasurement to the certificate this year? With their permission, I would add the change to the certificate, update the mileages, initial the changes, and make a note referring to all of the correspondence which will be included with the mileage certificate.

With the clarification of the layout of TH-57 (Bay Rd), the length appears to be 0.53 mile instead of 0.57 mile, and John Bull agrees with this value given the information we have. This is the change I would like to add to the 2023 Mileage Certificate:

-0.04 mi CL3 TH-57 remeasured

Surprisingly, the need for this remeasurement came to light as I was evaluating the length of class 2 TH-1, which I've discovered does not need to be remeasured as expected.

Thank you for your assistance, and I apologize that I did not have this information available for you sooner!

Good morning John,

I just realized that Ferrisburgh has already returned the 2023 Mileage Certificate, but I can still add a remeasurement to the Cert with the Selectboard's permission. However, I assume they would like your confirmation that the remeasurement is appropriate. Can you review the following information, and let me know if you feel anything is missing?

Given the clarification of the layout of TH-57, the length, and based on the map length of the road centerline data, the length likely 0.53 mile instead of 0.57 mile. This value is shorter than the length recorded in the survey (0.57 mi) and in the field measurement notes taken in 1993 by VTrans and accompanied by Larry Gebo from the Town of Ferrisburgh (see attached). However, I think that this new measure is appropriate, given that the survey consists of straight segments that do not strictly follow the road centerline (or even the pavement in places), and that it is also likely that the measurement began at the private road just to the east of the main house (based on the notes, also attached, for CL2 TH-1) instead of at the house.

Unless you have additional information that I haven't taken into account, I will ask the selectboard if it is ok if I add the following change to the Ferrisburgh Mileage Certificate:

-0.04 mi CL3 TH-57 remeasured

Surprisingly, the measure for CL2 TH-1 comes to 4.72 miles, although if the town line is actually at the sign (rather than the pavement change), then the measure would be 4.73 mi. Please let me know if you think that is the case!

Do you know which of the following "clues" is the best indicator of where the Ferrisburgh/Monkton town line really is along TH-1? It's possible it isn't known for certain, but figured I'd check just in case.

(Arrows mentioned are drawn on the image below)

1. Pavement change (blue arrow)

2. Town line sign (red arrow)
3. Parcel data for Ferrisburgh or Monkton (black or cyan arrows, respectively)

Good afternoon John,

I apologize for taking so long to get back with you! I plotted out the survey of TH-57 that you gave me (shown in pink on the image below), at least enough of it to try to infer the start point based on fitting the line to the existing roadway, as well as the description of the starting point in the survey. I wasn't exactly sure what they meant by the starting point description. I've indicated (see the red arrow in the image below) my best guess about where the CL2 highway ends (i.e. where TH-57 begins), but I was hoping you might have some insight that would confirm or improve the accuracy of the location? (Unfortunately I don't have my cell phone with me at the moment).
