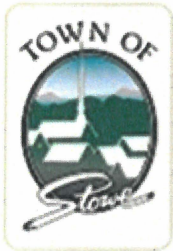
Hi Kerry –

I fat-fingered the mileage for TH 99 – the 0.52 mi. is correct, and is consistent with the paperwork we have.

Regarding the beginning of TH 99, I can't give you a definite answer whether the TH follows the shown parcel lines or the red line. We have no survey available. The red line, as drawn, follows an obvious "woods road" corridor and there is no real evidence of a road existing as shown on the parcel lines.

Pdf attached of appx. new end of TH 57. There is a gate across the roadway and the TH ends at the gate. I'm not sure if that helps, but the gate is shown on the recorded survey.

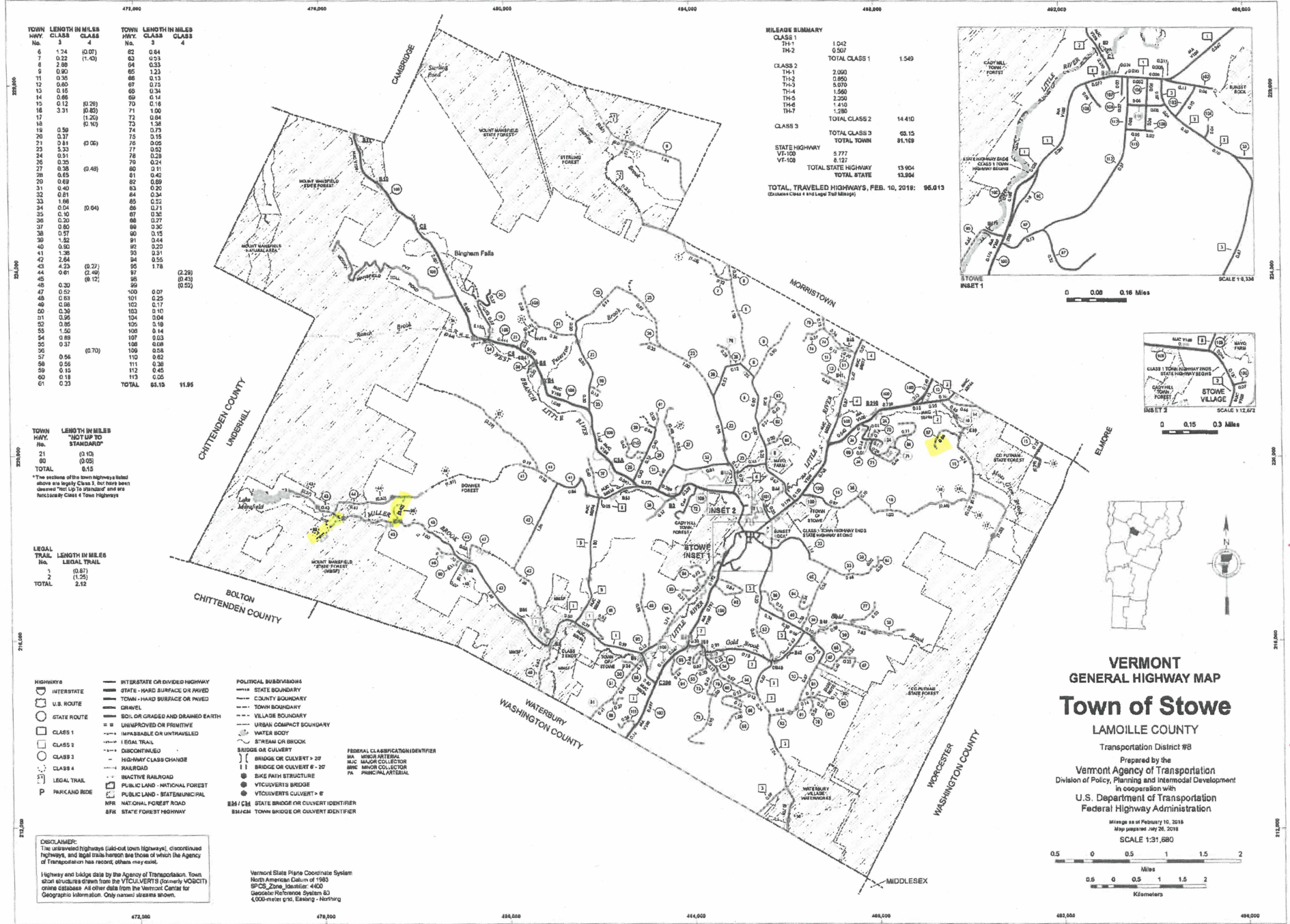

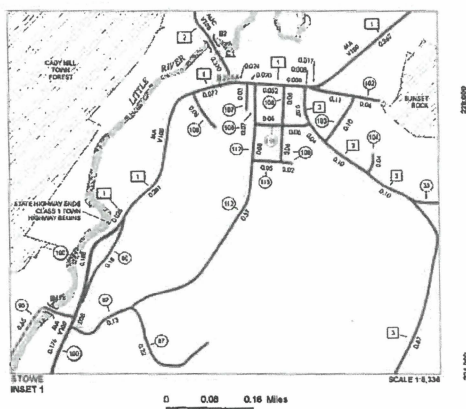

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2018, the Stowe Selectboard initiated a proceeding pursuant to 19 V.S.A. §708(a), on its own motion to determine whether the public good, necessity and convenience would be served by discontinuing Town Highway # 98, being approximately 0.43 miles in length and having a presumed width of one and one-half rods on each side of the existing traveled way; and

WHEREAS, notices of the time and date for examining the premises and hearing from persons interested in the proceeding were sent by certified mail in accordance with 19 V.S.A. §709 to all parties entitled to notice, including all abutters, the Town of Stowe Planning Commission, and the Commissioner of the Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and date for examining the premises and hearing from persons interested in the proceeding was also posted in the office of the Town Clerk and published in the *Stowe Reporter*, a local newspaper of general circulation more than ten days before the time set for the hearing; and

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2018, the Selectboard convened a hearing, conducted its examination of the premises, and took testimony regarding whether the discontinuance would serve the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Stowe.

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned Selectboard makes the following Findings of Fact:

The Selectboard is considering whether discontinuance of the entire 0.43 mile (+/-) length of Town Highway #98 serves the public good, convenience and necessity. Said Town Highway #98 is depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto as "Town Highway #98 0.43 miles" and is located between Old Country Road (Town Highway #44) and Nebraska Valley Road (Town Highway #43).

1. Town Highway #98 is a Class 4 town highway appearing on the Vermont General Highway Map for the Town of Stowe, prepared by the Vermont Agency of Transportation, dated July 26, 2018.

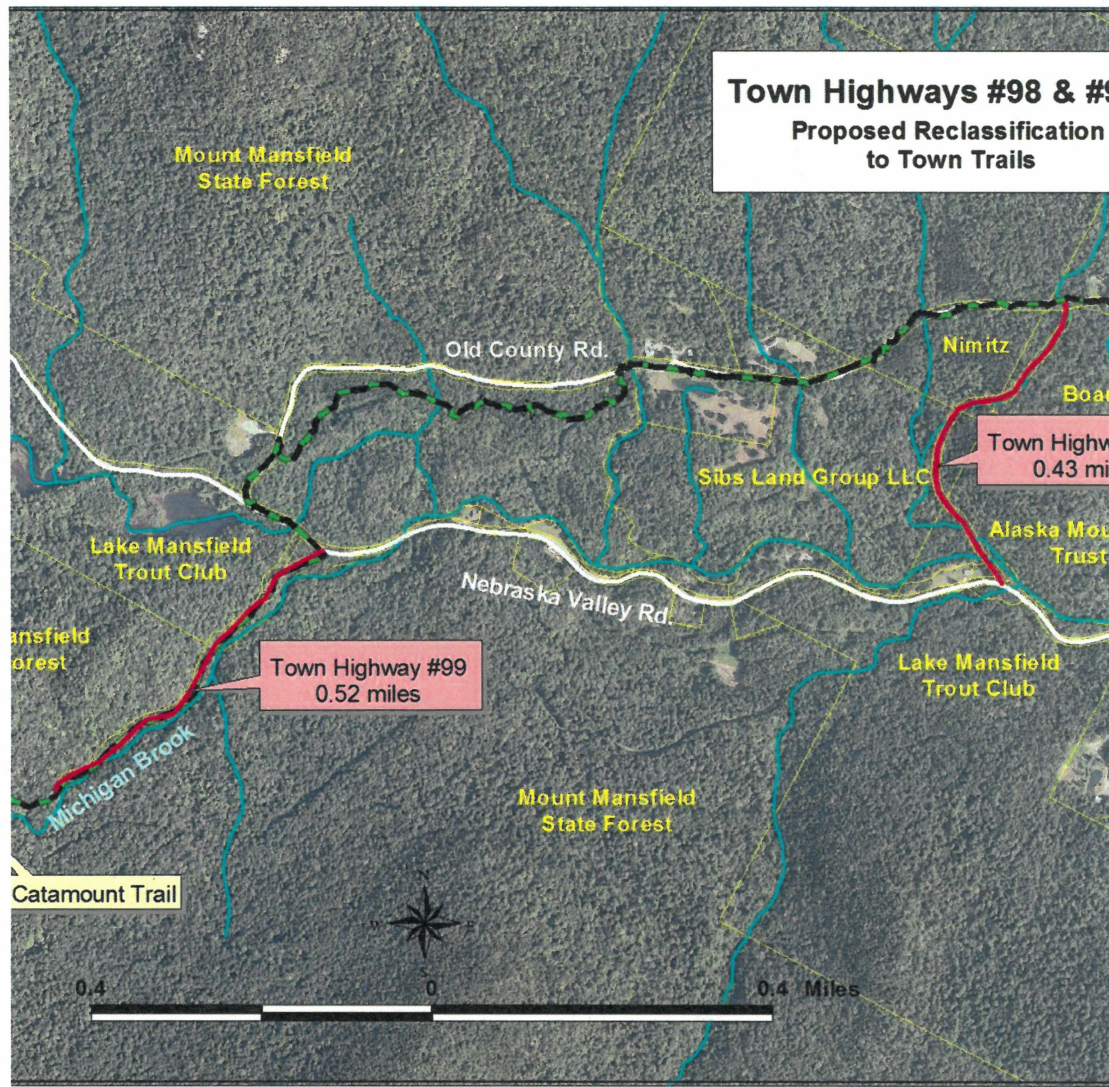
2. Town Highway #98 abuts properties owned by: Sibs Land Group, LLC, Alaska Mountain Trust, Bishop, Nimitz, Lake Mansfield Trout Club, and Boardman.

3. Town Highway #98 is, and has been for some time, impassable or untraveled by motor vehicles during any time of the year; therefore the Selectboard finds it is not necessary to maintain the road as a town highway for purposes of public good and convenience.

4. As a Class 4 town highway, the Town is under no legal obligation to maintain Town Highway #98.

The Selectboard is considering whether discontinuance of the entire 0.52 mile (+/-) length of Town Highway #99 serves the public good, convenience and necessity. Said Town Highway #99 is depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto as "Town Highway #99 0.52 miles" and is located southerly of Lake Mansfield, extending from Nebraska Valley Road in a southwesterly direction to its terminus.

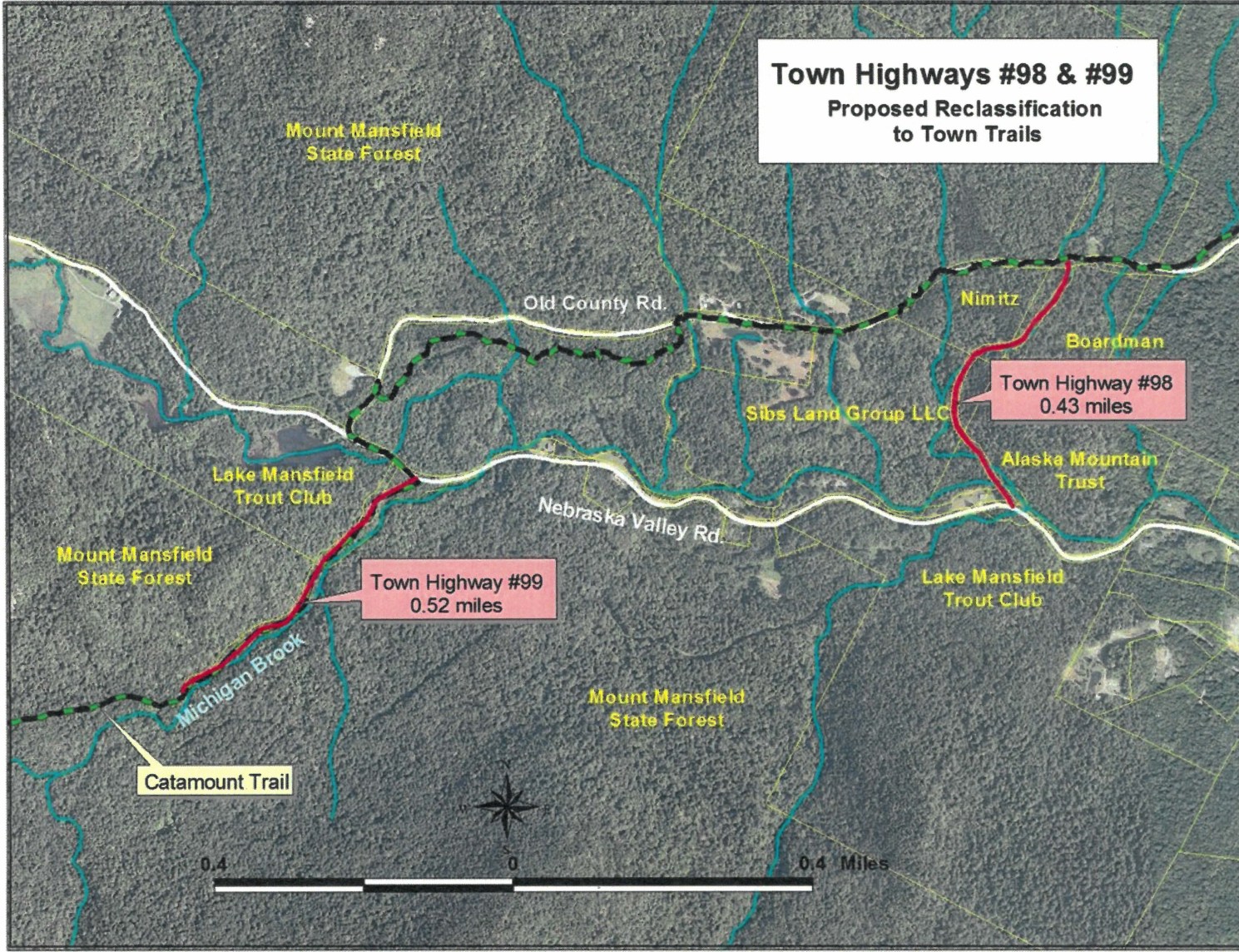
1. Town Highway #99 is a Class 4 town highway appearing on the Vermont General Highway Map for the Town of Stowe, prepared by the Vermont Agency of Transportation, dated July 26, 2018.

2. Town Highway #99 abuts properties owned by: Lake Mansfield Trout Club, the State of Vermont, Tucker/Lonstreth and Camp Dudley at Kinya LLC.

3. Town Highway #99 is, and has been for some time, impassable or untraveled by motor vehicles during any time of the year; therefore the Selectboard finds it is not necessary to maintain the road as a town highway for purposes of public good and convenience.

4. As a Class 4 town highway, the Town is under no legal obligation to maintain Town Highway #99.

IRREVOCABLE OFFER OF DEDICATION

This Irrevocable Offer of Dedication is made and entered into by and among **Randal and Sophie Hoder**, residents of the State of Vermont owning lands and premises in the Town of Stowe, County of Lamoille and State of Vermont ("OWNERS"), and the **Town of Stowe**, a Vermont municipality situated in the County of Lamoille and State of Vermont (the "Town").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, OWNERS are the owners of certain real property located at 518 Partridge Hill Road in the Town of Stowe (the "Property"), shown on a plan entitled "Lot Line Adjustment, William Robbins, Stowe, VT" prepared by Glenn Towne, dated March 2009, and recorded in Map Volume 18 at Page 103 of the Town of Stowe Land Records, having acquired title to such Property by virtue of the Quitclaim Deed of 518 Partridge Hill Road LLC, dated August 26 2014, recorded in Book 891 at Page 301 of the Town of Stowe Land Records; and

WHEREAS, OWNERS petitioned the Selectboard of the Town to consider discontinuance of 117 feet of T.H. 57 (Partridge Hill Road) at the southerly terminus of said T.H. #57 ("Requested Discontinunace"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said petition the Town warned a public hearing, notified affected property owners, took oral testimony and other evidence, and made a site visit to T.H. #57, all as required by Title 19 Vermont Statutes Annotated; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Selectboard has determined, by Order, to discontinue the Requested Discontinuance subject to certain conditions as set out in its Order;

WHEREAS, OWNERS propose to satisfy the above-described conditions in part by hereby irrevocably offering to dedicate to the Town a certain easement at the southerly terminus of the road after discontinuance in the form attached as Exhibit A hereto, said offer to be held in escrow by the Town and to be accepted as appropriate in the Town's discretion, but only in the event that Town first determines that the easement area, as built by OWNERS at their sole expense, meets the requirements of the Order and is suitable and satisfactory to the Town; and

WHEREAS, the above-described easement is dedicated to the Town free and clear of all encumbrances; and

WHEREAS, Randal Hoder and Sophie Hoder have delivered an executed easement deed (the "Easement Deed") to the Town for the above described offer of dedicated conveyance.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Selectboard's Order, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Randal Hoder and Sophie Hoder hereby grant and convey to the Town the following:

1. The aforementioned easement as more particularly described in the Easement Deed.

ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE OF TOWN HIGHWAY (19 V.S.A., Chapter 7)

Town Highway #57 (Partridge Hill Road)

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2018, the Stowe Selectboard initiated a proceeding pursuant to 19 V.S.A. §708(a), on the request of the abutting landowner to determine whether the public good, necessity and convenience would be served by discontinuing a portion of Town Highway #57 (Partridge Hill Road) being one hundred seventeen feet (117 ft.) at the southerly terminus of Partridge Hill Road; and

WHEREAS, notices of the time and date for examining the premises and hearing from persons interested in the proceeding were sent in accordance with 19 V.S.A. §709; and

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2018, the Selectboard convened a hearing, conducted its examination of the premises, and took testimony regarding whether the discontinuance would serve the public good, necessity and convenience of the inhabitants of the Town of Stowe;

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned Selectboard makes the following Findings of Fact:

The proposal before the Selectboard is to consider whether discontinuance of one hundred seventeen feet (117 +/-) of Town Highway #57 (Partridge Hill Road) at its southerly terminus serves the public good, convenience and necessity. Said section of Town Highway #57 proposed to be discontinued is depicted on a survey entitled "Survey Showing Highway Discontinuance of Portion of Partridge Hill Road (Stowe T.H. #57) and New Turnaround on Land of Randal P. Hoder and Sophie Hoder, 518 Partridge Hill Road," dated May 2018 by Grenier Engineering, P.C. and to be recorded simultaneously herewith in the Stowe Land Records (the "Survey").

1. The property having its legal access from, and abutting, the portion of Town Highway #57 under consideration for discontinuance is owned by Randal P. Hoder and Sophie Hoder.
2. The proposed discontinuance would relieve the Town of its obligation, and the related expenses, to maintain the portion of Town Highway #57 proposed to be discontinued.
3. The discontinuance of the portion of Town Highway #57 under consideration for discontinuance will improve safety for Town employees and contractors, because the abutting owners, Randal P. Hoder and Sophie Hoder, have agreed to construct a turnaround and grant the Town of Stowe an easement for said turnaround, at the owners' expense and located on the owners' land, at the new terminus of Town Highway #57.
4. No party appearing at the public hearing objected to the proposed discontinuance.
5. No party will be entitled to damages as a result of the discontinuance.

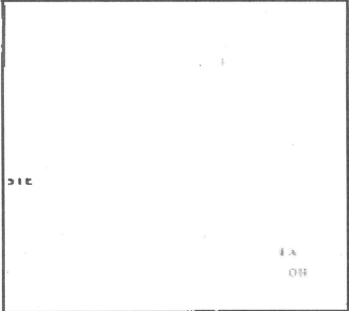

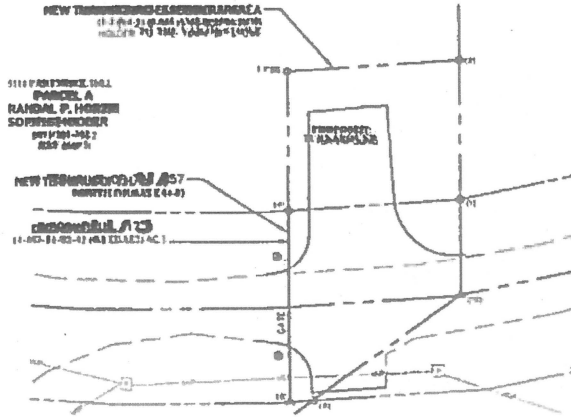

amount funded through LOT be based on the debt service schedule year-to-year rather than a set amount as was done with the Stowe Arena bond. siting of electoral generation facilities in the Town of Stowe. The Board discussed the proposed language stating that the Town would not support solar projects greater than 15kW on historic buildings within the Stowe Historic Overlay District that are clearly visible from public right-of-way. It was noted that with technology changes, the size of the equipment for solar energy is rapidly shrinking, and 15kW might be too restrictive. It was discussed that the reason for not wanting large solar projects in historic districts is because of aesthetics and maintaining the characteristics of the district. The Board agreed to change it to state that the Town does not support ground mounted solar greater than 15Kw that was visible from the Right of Way in the Historic Overlay District.

The Board will hold public hearings to take input from the community on the proposed Town Plan Revisions on Monday October 22nd and Tuesday November 13th.

Other Business – Managers Report

Mr. Safford reminded the board that there will be a Special Meeting at 5:30pm on Thursday November 1st for public discussion prior to the November 6th Election Day voting.

The Board also discussed the ongoing problem with hypodermic needles being found in the Town. Mr. Safford noted they have been found mostly around the Rec Path and in the Village. When needles are found, the public is encouraged to call the police department at their non-emergency number to report it and have them safely disposed of.

At 6:55pm, on a motion by Mr. Van Dyke, seconded by Ms. Hagerty, the Board went in to Executive Session to discuss legal matters.

At 7:12 the Board came out of executive session.

There being no further business, Chair Adams adjourned the meeting at 7:13pm.
