

Gentlemen:

With regard to the completion of the enclosed Highway Mileage Certificates, we wish to call your attention to a change in State and Town Highway mileage in your town.







INTRODUCTION

The above entitled matter came on for hearing pursuant to Chapter 7, Title 19, Vermont Statutes Annotated, before the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Barton on February 26, 1979, pursuant to Notice dated January 26, 1979, a copy of which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof, served on January 26, 1979 upon Anatole Duquette, Alex Harner, President of Barton Motor Company, Inc., Christine Larocque, individually and as wife of Roger Larocque, Mary Shaw, individually and as wife of Mark Shaw, Harvey Robitaille, individually and as husband of Beverly Robitaille, Ruth Nault, individually and as joint owner in occupancy with Royal Kinsley, Linda Hinton, individually and as wife of Brian Hinton, Mildred Baker, Bernard Grondin, Victor Moquin, individually and as husband of Winifred Moquin, Dorothy Bardelli, individually and as wife of Louis Bardelli, Leonard Rock, individually and as husband of Carol Rock, Stanley Davis, individually and as husband of Beverly Davis, Ralph Nault, individually and as husband of Pauline Nault, and Irma Lewis, Clerk of Barton Village, Incorporated. Further, an Acceptance of Service of said Notice was executed by Earl Randall as Chairman of the Barton Planning Commission. FINDS OF FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS

Upon examination of the premises and consideration of all oral and written presentations and exhibits produced at said hearing, the Board of Selectmen for the Town of Barton finds and concludes as follows:

1. The Board of Selectmen finds that service of Notice and publication of the same was complete as to all interested parties, and that the same was properly posted.
2. Route 16, otherwise known as the Barton-Westmore Road, running easterly from Barton Village to the town of Westmore is a Town Highway which has been in need of repair and improvement for many years.
3. In particular said highway needs to be improved for reasons of safety, public good, necessity and convenience by improvement of that portion of said Route 16 delineated on plans filed in the office of the Barton Town Clerk under date of January 25, 1979 entitled "Plan of Proposed Improvement Route 16 Barton-Westmore Road Project KSO 286(1)SA 1.174 miles".
4. The Vermont Agency of Transportation, Department of Highways is responsible for any highway project undertaken with the assistance of Federal aid highway funds, including those undertaken by political subdivisions of the State of Vermont.
5. The proposed surveying and/or resurfacing and laying out and/or altering of said Route 16 is best undertaken with the assistance of Federal aid highway funds.

6. 73. Based upon sales of land in the area and the size, shape, grade and use of the subject property, the Waller property is found to have a total value of \$30,000.00.

74. The property required to be taken from Waller in connection with said alteration and laying out of said Route 16 consists of .26 acres all presently lying in the right-of-way of Route 16 and Town Highway #3 as more particularly described on Exhibit 1 and that said property has a value of taking of \$160.00. See also attachment O affixed and incorporated herein.

IN RE: LANDS OF ANATOLE M. DUQUETTE

75. The surveying and/or resurveying and laying out and altering of Route 16 requires the taking of 4.0 acres from property of Anatole Duquette together with four temporary slope easements, two temporary construction easements, two temporary driveway easements, one permanent slope easement and the removal and replacement of a fence and water line.

76. The highest and best use of the property of Duquette is a residential-agricultural form of use.

77. Based upon sales of land in the area and the size, shape, grade and use of the subject property, the Duquette property is found to have a total value of \$48,000.00.

78. The property required to be taken from Anatole Duquette in connection with the alteration and laying out of Route 16 consists of 4.0 acres, consisting of 2.3 acres lying outside the existing limits of Route 16 and 1.7 acres being all right, title and interest of the landowner in and to land lying within the existing right-of-way limit of Route 16 together with four temporary slope easements, two temporary construction easements, two temporary driveway easements and one permanent slope easement and the removal and replacement of fences and a water pipe line as particularly described in Exhibit 1 and that said property and rights have a value of taking of \$3,260.00. 97. In accordance with 19 V.S.A. §346 the Board of Selectmen fixes May 29, 1979, as the date by which the owners of the lands herein taken shall remove any fences, timber, wood or trees on the property subject to the taking herein and the Town of Barton shall take possession of said premises on and after said date as aforesaid. This order shall be served upon interested landowners by certified mail-return receipt as of the date of recording hereof.


