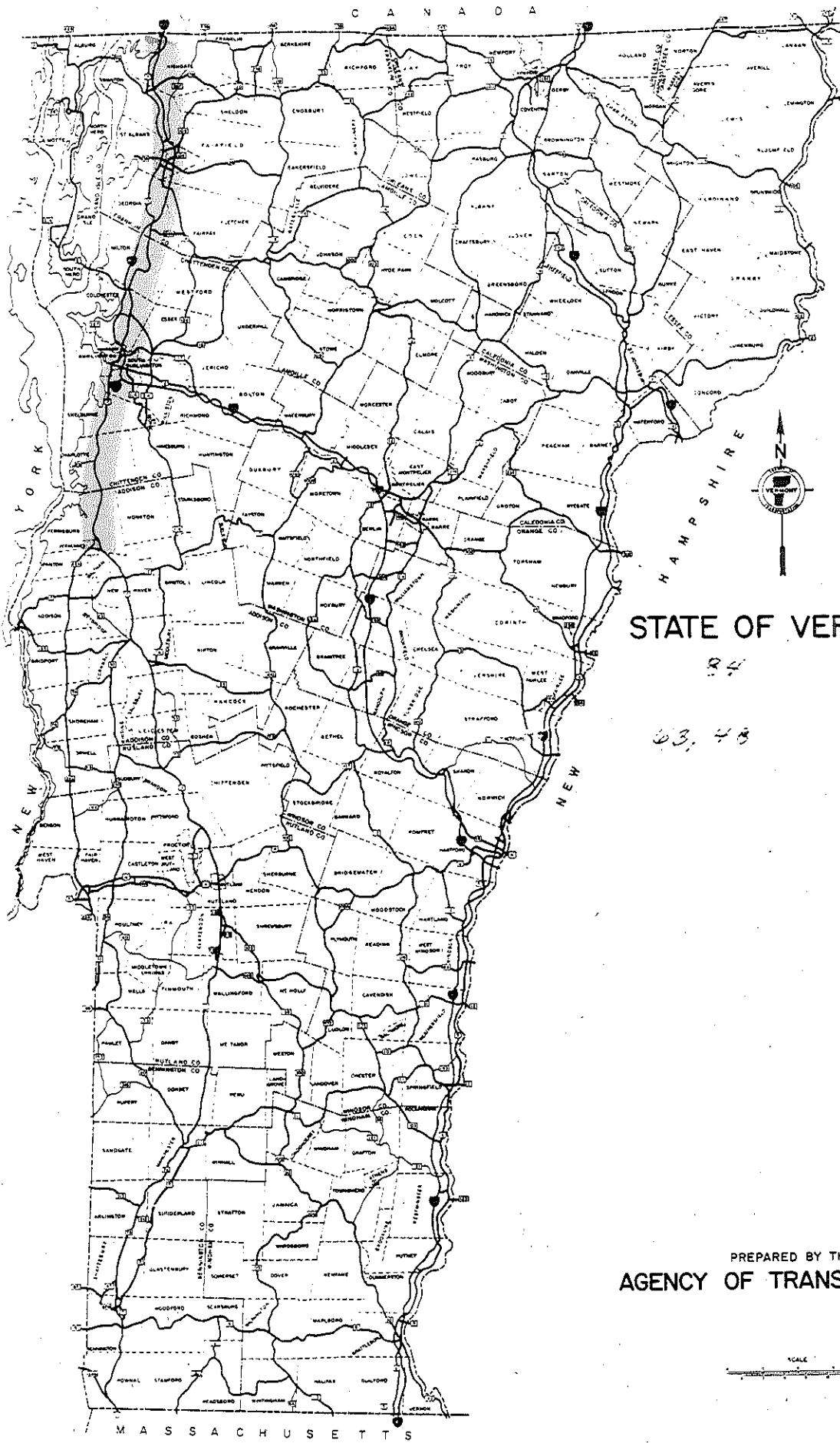


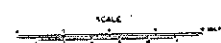

fore said, shall be the public county road through said towns, and shall be opened by the selectmen, of the respective towns, on or before the first day of September next, and the selectmen of the several towns aforesaid, are hereby empowered and directed to set over any old road, or to proceed in the same way in the assessment of damages, as if the said road had been laid by the said selectmen of such towns respectively: And such road shall be made and kept in repair, as required by the laws of this state directing the mode of making and repairing highways.

Provided, and it is hereby further enacted, That the expence of laying-out and surveying such road, shall be paid by the persons who shall employ the committee in such service; and any person or persons shall have liberty to call the committee aforesaid, to view any ground they please, at their own expence.

Chapter 13.

An act granting relief to *Abel Spencer* and *James Clagborn*, in a certain case therein mentioned.

IT is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont, That *Abel Spencer* and *James Clagborn*, are hereby released and discharged from the payment of a certain note, given to the treasurer of this state, for a fine and cost of suit, arising from a prosecution had by this state against *Solomon Spafford*, in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, except so much of said note as was given for the payment of cost.

Provided nevertheless, That if the said *Abel* and *James* do not pay to the state's attorney of *Rutland* county, so much of said note as was given for said cost, by the first day of May next, they shall take no benefit by this act.

Chapter 14.

An act in addition to an act, entitled "*An act to lay out a stage or post road from the court-house in Vergennes, to the court-house in Burlington,*" passed February the eighteenth, one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven; and also in addition to an act, entitled "*An*

act appointing a committee to lay a post or stage road from Onion-River to Canada line."

Committee to lay a road from Burlington, C. Route to Onion River.

IT is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont, That David Russell, Josiah Upham and Benjamin Harrington, be, and they hereby are appointed a committee to lay out and survey a post or stage road from the courthouse in Burlington, to meet said post or stage road, which runs from said Onion River to Canada line. And said committee shall govern themselves, in all things, according to the directions of the aforesaid acts, and shall receive pay for their services, from the town treasury of the town of Burlington, if the town will vote to pay it; if not, they shall be paid by the persons applying to them to do the service. And said road shall not be altered only in the manner pointed out by said acts.

Chapter 15.

An act appointing a new Collector of a land tax in Montgomery.

WHEREAS the Legislature of the State of Vermont, at their session, in October, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, passed an act assessing a tax of two cents per acre on all the lands in the township of Montgomery, in the county of Franklin, for the purpose of making and repairing roads, in said township; and appointed Samuel Barnard, Esq. collector, to collect said tax, who, rebolly declines accepting said appointment.

Preamble.

Therefore,

IT is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont, That Stephen Royce, Esq. of Berksbury, be, and he is hereby appointed a collector, in the room and stead of the said Samuel Barnard, to collect said tax. And any justice of the peace, within and for the county of Franklin, is hereby authorized and directed, to issue his warrant to the said Stephen, to collect said tax. And the said Stephen is hereby vested with the same powers, with which the said Samuel was vested; and is subjected to the same restrictions and regulations, as provided and directed in the aforementioned act.
