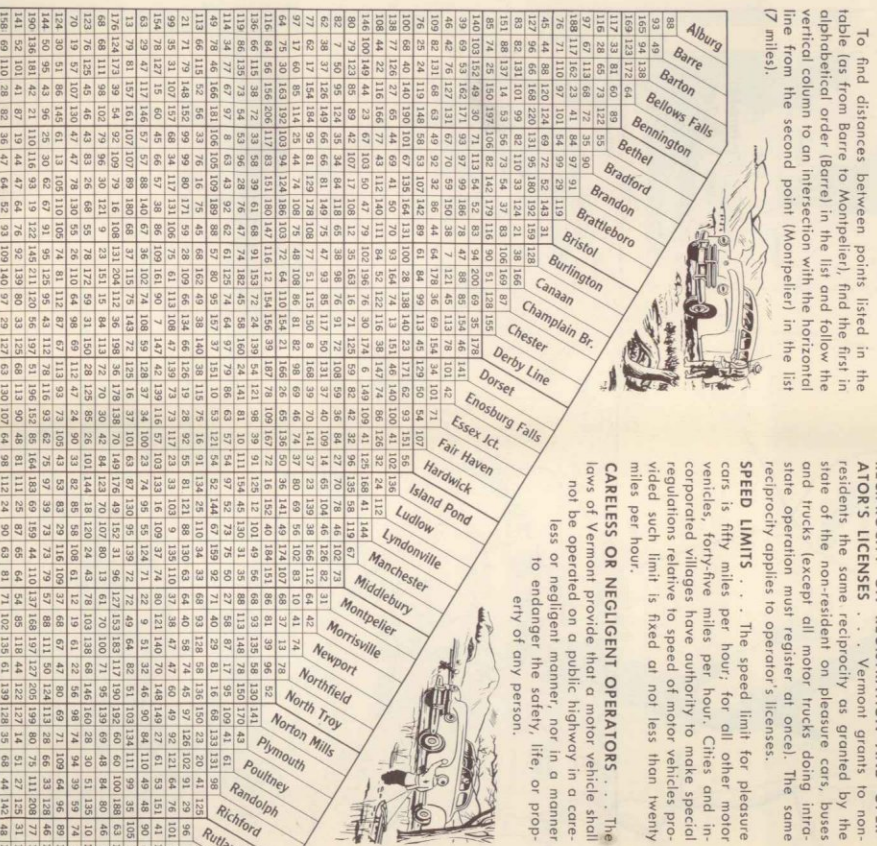


TABLE OF APPROXIMATE DISTANCES

SYNOPSIS OF MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS 1949

Subject to Changes by Legislature

RECIPROCAL REGISTRATION AND OPERATOR'S LICENSES

Vermont grants to non-residents the same reciprocity as granted by the state of the non-resident on pleasure cars, buses and trucks (except all motor trucks doing interstate operation must register at once). The same reciprocity applies to operator's licenses.

SPEED LIMITS

The speed limit for pleasure cars is fifty miles per hour; for all other motor vehicles, forty-five miles per hour. Cities and incorporated villages have authority to make special regulations relative to speed of motor vehicles provided such limit is fixed at not less than twenty miles per hour.

CARELESS OR NEGLIGENT OPERATORS

The laws of Vermont provide that a motor vehicle shall not be operated on a public highway in a careless or negligent manner, nor in a manner to endanger the safety, life, or property of any person.

Open Seasons
 Trout—Brook, Brown, Lake Lewis, Steelhead, Golden Trout, Splined and landlocked Salmon—May 1 to Aug. 31 (incl.), Pike Fresh—May 1 to Nov. 14 (incl.), Bass—July 1 to Nov. 30 (incl.). (See Vermont laws for exceptions to the above applying to: Freedom Pond and Hervey's Lake in Colchester County; Forest, Big Averill, Little Averill, Wells, Norton, and Moulden lakes in Essex County; Willoughby Lake, Seymour Lake, Lake Memphremagog, Echo Lake, Shadow Lake and Parker Lake in Orleans County; Childeren Lake in Rutland County; and Lake Champlain.)

Legal Lengths and Daily Limits

Trout—brook, Brown, lock, Green, Golden, Steelhead (see Vermont laws for exceptions on brook and Willoughby River). Rainbow, Grayling and black spotted—no less than 6 inches in length; not more than 5 pounds or more than 20 fish. Lake Trout and landlocked Salmon—no less than 15 inches; limit 2 fish either trout or salmon or one of each, or more than 10 pounds. Black Bass—no less than 10 inches in length and not more than 3 fish (7 fish in Lake Champlain). Pikelet—no less than 12 inches in length or more than 25 pounds (20 pounds, not less than 12 inches in length nor more than 25 pounds).

GAME

Open Seasons
 Deer—one deer with horns not less than three inches long, between Nov. 13 and Nov. 25 (both dates inclusive). Rabbits or Hares—Oct. 1-Oct. 29 (incl.). Gray Squirrels—Oct. 1-Oct. 31 (incl.). Colonial Rabbits—not protected, except in Childeren and Bennington Counties (see Vermont laws). Moose, Caribou, Elk—protected at all times.

GAME BIRDS

Ruffed Grouse (Partridge)—Oct. 1-Oct. 31 (incl.). Woodcock, Duck—Kingdom of Sandwich during month of October;—McKenney's 4 for season per day; 4 for season.

GREEN MOUNTAIN HORSE ASSOCIATION

BRIDLE PATHS

The roads used for these specified bridle paths are the dirt road which run throughout the entire state, generally higher in the hills than the main highways. They are soft surfaced. Shady, always beautiful and very seldom used by motor cars. All present there are many miles of them marked, with stops arranged every ten to twenty miles for the rider's convenience for luncheon or over night. One can generally count on the bridle paths being in good condition from May 1st to November 1st, and in some places for

It is contrary to law for more than three persons to ride in the driving compartment of any motor vehicle. All drivers are requested to observe the following precautions in the interests of safety on the highways: When meeting another motor vehicle at night, depress headlights to the low beam. Watch out for pedestrians, particularly children on foot. Slow down at schools, crosswalks, and dangerous intersections. Stop before passing a stationary school bus. Signal the driver of the car behind when intending to change course. Keep the car under control at all times. Keep in line when nearing the top of a hill or a curve. Have car inspected regularly and maintain it properly. Never drive after drinking intoxicating liquor.

HEALTH CONDITIONS IN VERMONT

All places offering lodging and meals must pass inspection by State Department of Public Health. Vermont is justly known as a healthy state, and for years has maintained its position as a leader in the control of communicable diseases. Typhoid fever is almost unknown in this state, a result which has been accomplished by close supervision of the State Department of Public Health over all public water supplies, sewage disposal and other possible means of infection. Boys' and girls' camps are visited frequently by an experienced sanitary engineer, and camp owners make constant use of the facilities of the department whenever sanitary or disease problems arise. Besides the sanitary engineering division, the department maintains active divisions of laboratory, communicable diseases, tuberculosis, infantile paralysis and public health nursing, all of which are at the service of tourists, campers and visitors, receiving attention either directly or the headquarters of Burlington, or through local health officers in the cities or towns.

VISIT THE LONG TRAIL

From one end of Vermont to the other the Long Trail follows the skyline of a two hundred mile mountain range, dipping into valleys, climbing over summits, passing through forests, sometimes skirting lakes and ponds. Approach trails lead up to the Long Trail from nearby highways, and in addition there are highways which cross the Trail itself. You can visit the Long Trail or one of the beautiful summits in a single day's trip from various points to Summit, Montpelier, Rutland, Vermont.

State Highways

Vermont's state highway system of 1,804 miles, shown in red on this map, is maintained by the state's Department of Highways. Three-quarters of these roads are paved, with more pavements being added each year. The remainder are gravel surfaced and under continuous maintenance. All state highways (except for a short section in Swanton, Natch on Route 108) are kept plowed and sandbed throughout the winter. Except during a storm or when it is raining and freezing, good winter driving conditions will be found. Always carry the chains and a shovel for emergencies.
