Camp Sites—tent floors, trailers—\$1.00; lean-tos—\$1.50 per day per car of five persons or less.

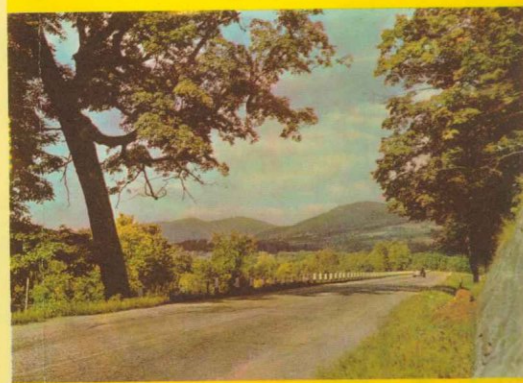
BATH HOUSE LOCKERS—10 cents per person.
