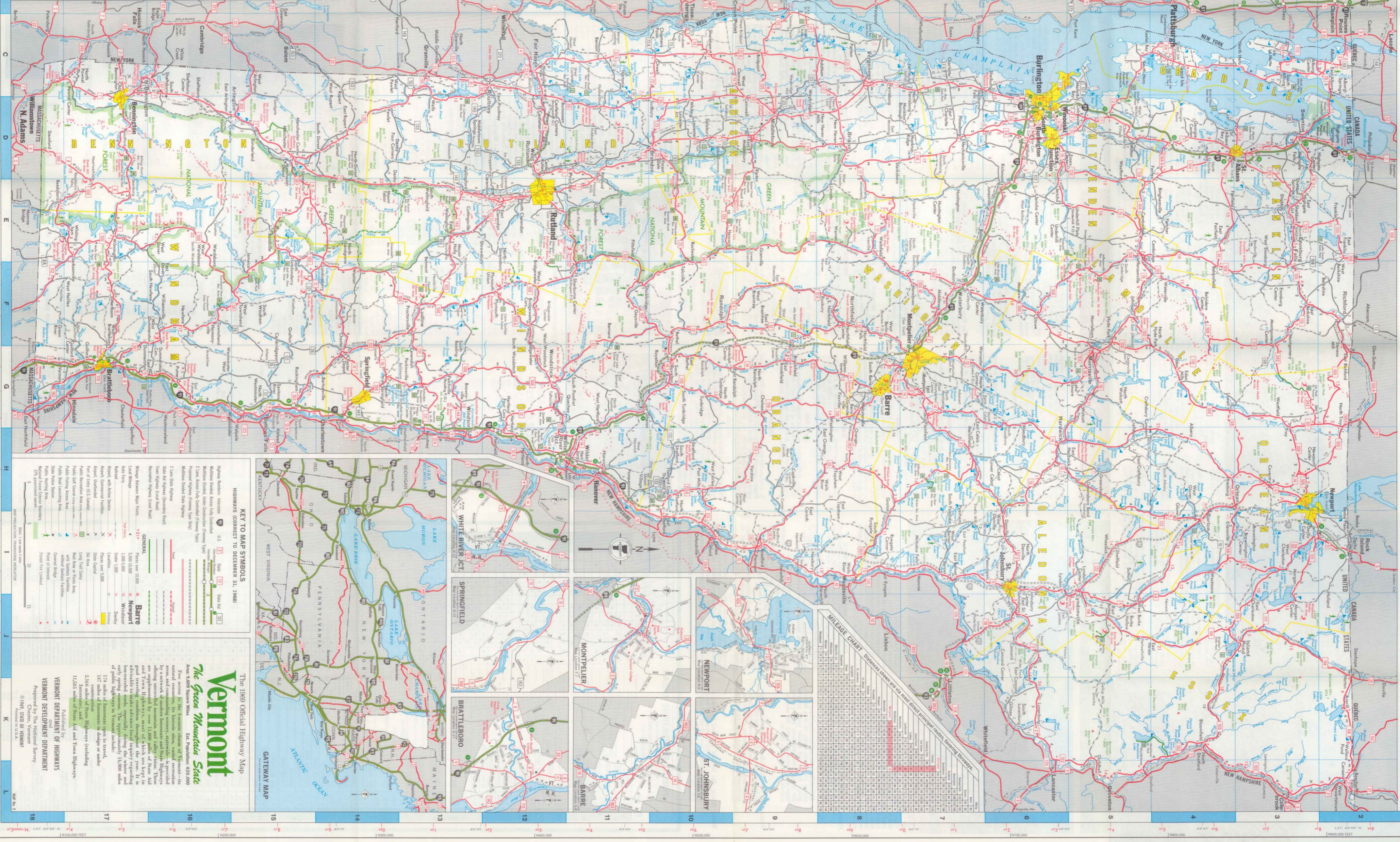
THREE COORDINATE SYSTEMS
