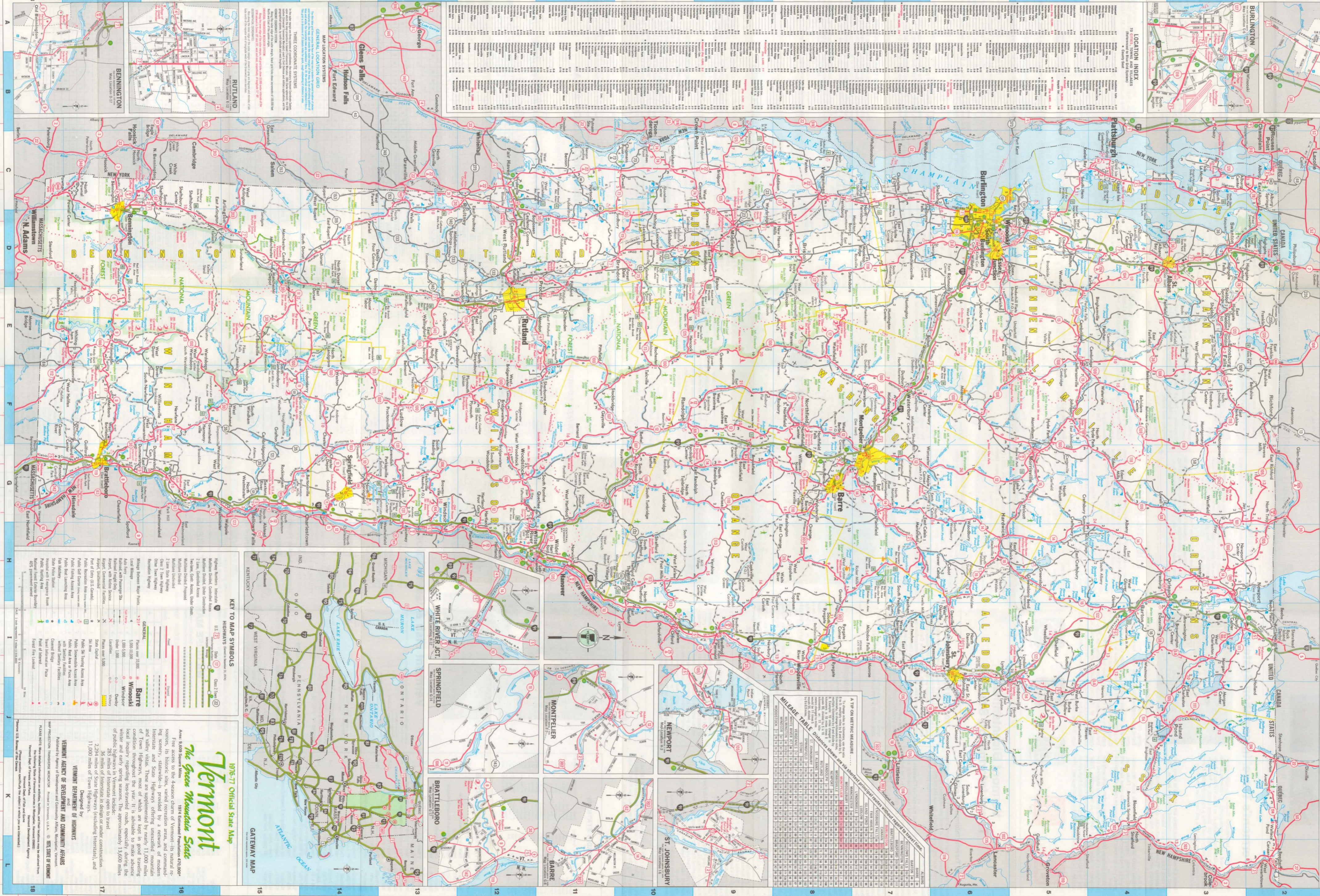
HIGHWAY SPEED LIMITS IN VERMONT

Free access to the 4-season charm of Vermont—its natural resources, its historic sites, varied recreation areas, and commanding views of the State—has been provided by a network of modern and well-maintained State Highways. These are supplemented by nearly 11,000 miles of local roads, most of which are kept in good traveling condition throughout the year. It is advisable to make advance local inquiry regarding less-traveled roads, especially during the winter and early spring seasons. The approximately 13,600 miles of public roads are maintained by the State, local municipalities, or private owners.
